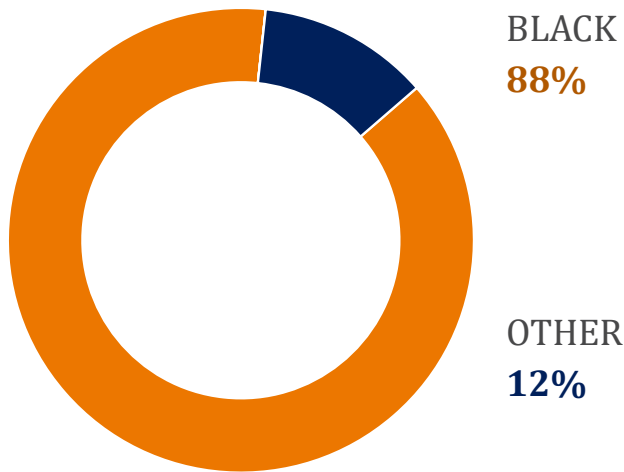

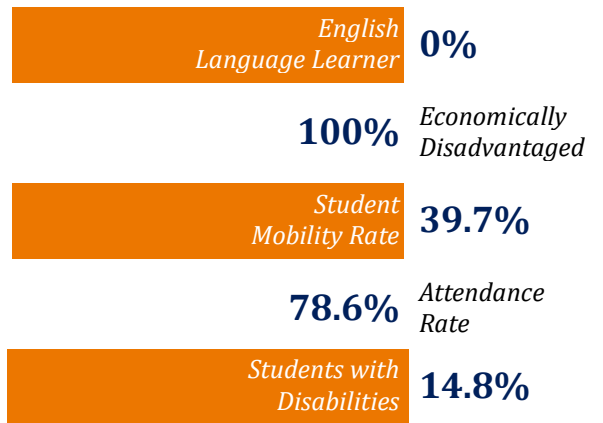


Student Demographics

Progress towards Goals

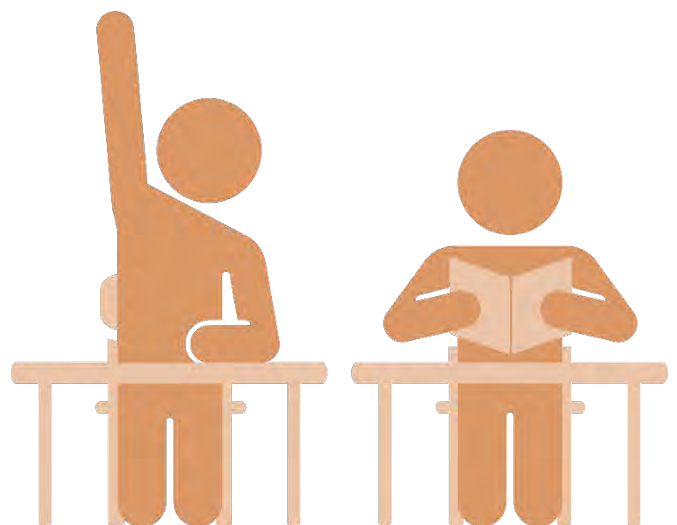
The percentage proficient in ELA increased from 20% to 21.5%, while the percentage proficient in Math increased from 4.2% to 13.8%. The attendance rate decreased from 80.3% in 2023-2024 to 78.6% in 2024-2025. The Academy earned three stars in Progress.

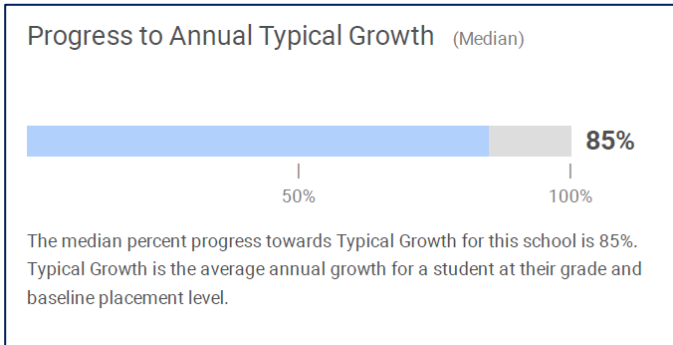

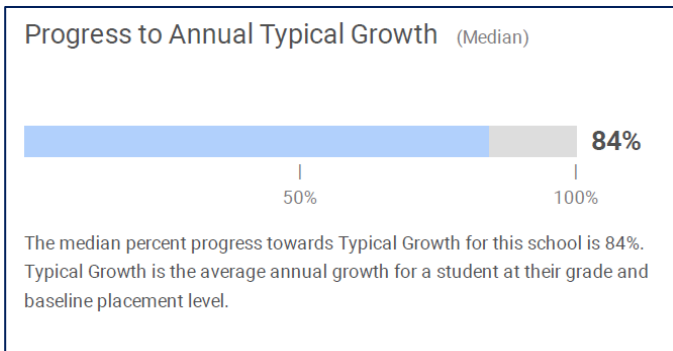

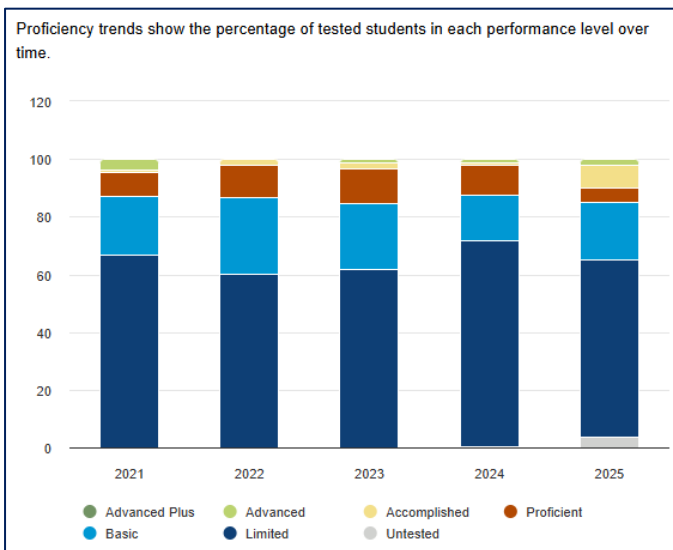
iReady Data Reading
